

MySQL - Database connection

If you are having trouble connecting to your database, check your config file to make sure the port and bind-address have been set.

Example Config:

```
/etc/mysql/my.cnf
port = 3306
bind-address            = 127.0.0.1 localhost
#bind-address          = 159.203.5.166 external
```

In this example, the `localhost bind-address` is not commented out so it will be used as the `db.host` value in the POST /instance configuration. The port is set to `3306`. In this case when you authenticate a connector instance, use `127.0.0.1:3306` as the value for `db.host`.

If you want to expose the `external bind-address`, then comment out the `localhost bind-address`.

If you want to expose both sources (`localhost` and `external`), then comment out both addresses.
